Seeds, seedlings, cuttings and rootstock (Please label all, and heirloom seeds are best, as they can be saved from)

All things gardening, whether it be gardening magazines, toilet rolls, worm tea, etc

Jars

Paper bags and small boxes for seeds or produce

### What can't I place on the grow cart?

Meat

Mushrooms

Chook and compost scraps

Selling anything

Alcohol

# **Lee's News**



Wow! What an amazing start to term three we have had. Children and staff have come back and engaged in our kindy program with gusto, taking off from where they left last term.

It is at this time of year we reflect on the distance that each of our children have travelled. We measure and celebrate their growth and acknowledge challenges and formulate next steps. This process is an integral part of each child's ongoing learning cycle, helping us to target support and provide intellectual stretch where it's needed to ensure that our children are developing the skills needed to make them powerful learners.

Last year, we trialled the development and use of a Transition to School Statement and received great feedback from schools and parents around the accuracy, relevance and clarity of the information shared in the document. Due to this success, we are once again creating these statements to support each child's transition and continuity of learning across educational sectors. The purpose of this statement is to support both, children and families as they transition out of the kindergarten setting into school. Through a direct and succinct statement created collaboratively together, we will share each child's strength, challenges and other information we think the school need to know about each child's needs as they enter the school system. I know this may seem a little early to be thinking about school, but we feel that time is needed to have meaningful conversations about school selections (if needed), individual children's needs and supports that may need to be negotiated to assist transition. We aim for each child to have a completed statement ready to take with them prior to their first visit to school. We have sent home blank transition statements for parents to complete, along with an invitation for a sharing meeting to collaboratively create the statement together with staff if parents wish to do so. We have set aside two days and evenings (one day allocated per group) next week to conduct these meetings. Nell and I will conduct the majority of the Frogs group meetings and I will join Kerry to do the Bugs group meetings. If you would like to attend a sharing meeting with staff, please book online to reserve a spot.

As part of our focus on developing powerful readers through oral language, we are focussing on the promotion of book borrowing at kindy. We know that loads of families have great books at home, but we also know that **consistently** borrowing a diverse range of books from an early age, sets children up with excellent habits which support the development of essential and critical reading behaviours.


To support the development of each child's consistent borrowing behaviours, staff will support those children who haven't had time to borrow a book in the morning with their parents. We will allocate a time each day to help each child select and borrow a book independently for them to share with parents and family members at home. Please ensure that you send a borrowing bag to kindy each day with your child. Remember, our greatest readers are created in the laps of their loved ones!

# **Kindy Housekeeping**

### Bookmark Library Borrowing

As mentioned by Lee we are going to be promoting more library borrowing within the kindy. To assist families with this, we will be helping your child through the day to borrow a book. (We still prefer you to share this experience with your child, but understand time is short in the mornings)

What do you need to do:-

- If you have a book to return please place that in the returns box before you hang the library bag on the hanger
- Hang your child's named library bag on the book hanger near the library area. (Note: only children with bags will be able to borrow)
- Staff will help your child during the day to borrow a book and place it in their library bag
- The library bag will then be returned to the hanger
- Collect your child's bag at the end of the session
