

Have a look at some of the wonderful, creative ways our children are representing their knowledge of number.





Term 2 PreLit learning

This term we have introduced the PreLit program. This program is designed for children to help develop the foundational skills that will support their ongoing literacy development in a sequential and ordered way. This program follows a scope and sequence that develops one skill and then builds into the next.

There are two components to implementing this program in the kindy setting.

Component 1: A Book focus: So far this term we have spent time focusing on 3 books. These include Dear Zoo, Too Many Pears, and The Very Hungry caterpillar. Through these stories we have started to look at the structure of books and building our understanding of stories and print. We have explored the titles, front covers, authors, illustrators, the words, the way the words are written, the direction of print, and building our vocabulary through exploring our understanding of words within the stories. The children love to listen to stories, however they continue to build on other skills as they analyse and express their

understanding of what they are seeing and hearing. The shared conversations between the children and the way in which they build each other's understanding through sharing their knowledge has been incredible. By revisiting the book and story multiple times across two to three weeks has allowed children to notice the finer details in the story and the illustrations, things that we have never ever noticed before. Component 2: Phonemic awareness: the phonemic awareness

component begins to build a clear understanding and meaning of basic literacy skills in short explicit learning activities and conversations. These begin with supporting children to gain an understanding of the concept of a spoken word and how we use words to talk to each other. This builds to helping children know that oral sentences can be broken into word units. Through this

activity we have fun breaking up sentences and counting words. The next session leads us into recognising that words can be spoken or written and then we move onto the concepts of a written word. This includes supporting children to recognise that letters written in a specific order create words. After this we move onto exploring the idea that spoken

words can be written down and we can then read them back. This is fun as children explore making their own sentences and having the teachers write them and read them back to them. From this area we start to really break down the words. We look at long and short words before we then play with syllable counting. These short and explicit teaching moments within the day have been playful and fun. While all children develop these skills at their

own pace, they continue to build the foundations for ongoing literacy learning, and so far we have had lots of fun playing with words.
