Hello Everyone.

It's been a great start to term 4 and we hope you all enjoyed your holidays.

We are well into our term 4 learning program and last week we enjoyed our outdoor kindy days. These days were great fun with lots of food, outdoor fun and waterplay. We only came inside to use the bathrooms and also when we practiced our invacuation. We had the local CFS officers and fire truck come to visit us on Tuesday and Thursday of week 2. This was fabulous as we got to find out about the truck, the uniforms and the fire hoses.

This week we will start our Dancify sessions with Heidi. These are great fun and we learn some pretty cool dances, plus we love Heidi! You may see some pretty cool moves practiced over the next few weeks. These dances will all come together on our concert night. Our concert prep is about to be in full swing. You will probably hear your children singing away at home, as the songs may end up stuck in their heads at the end of each day. Over the next few weeks we will be practicing our songs, working on the signs and actions and preparing our props. An exciting time of the year!

We are looking forward to Grandparents and Special Friends Day this week. The children will be doing some cooking in preparation and helping to make our space tidy for our special visitors.

This week we will be celebrating International Children's Day across the week, introducing and discussing different cultures and where our family comes from. We have a world map outside on the verandah and if you could write down some information about your family heritage/culture that would be great to support us with our discussions.

You may have noticed that we have had a couple of extra adults on site in the past few weeks. We currently have Alexandra, a Masters Teaching Student, from UniSA with us. She will be on placement for the first 4 weeks of term. We also have Amy with us one day a week this term. Amy is a TafeSA student, studying her Certificate 3 in Early Childhood Services. We would like to welcome both of our students and look forward to supporting them on their learning journey.

Next Tuesday afternoon we will have the Hon. David Spiers MP, Minister for Environment and Water visiting us. He will be coming to see what we have been doing regarding sustainability and we hope the children will be able to share some of these things with him.

SUNSMART PRACTICES AT LOBETHAL KINDY

Lobethal Kindy has just renewed our SunSmart Membership. Being SunSmart means a balance between sun protection to lower the risk of skin cancer and sun exposure for the production and maintenance of vitamin D. Ultraviolet (UV) radiation is both the major cause of skin cancer and the best natural source of vitamin D. Vitamin D is essential for the development of strong bones and muscles.

Overexposure to UV radiation from the sun causes skin damage, with childhood and adolescence being critical times when this exposure is more likely to contribute to skin cancer later in life. Babies and children are often at kindergarten during the peak UV times during the day, making it essential for us to not only have practices in place to protect the children in our care, but also to educate and role model the importance of sun protection.

As SunSmart Early Childhood Centre we have policies and practices in place that reduce the risk of skin damage and skin cancer amongst children and educators at the centre. Cancer Council SA recommends implementing a sun protection policy during terms 1, 3 and 4 (or from 1 August through to 30 April for those centres who don't operate on school terms) and when the UV radiation level is 3 and above at other times.

Please ensure your child wears clothing that protects their skin, for example t-shirts and longer sleeve garments. Please do not send your child in shoestring or singlet tops. They will also require a SunSmart hat every day they attend kindy. You will also find sunscreen at the sign in for you to apply if you haven't done so already at home in the morning. Staff will then work with the children to reapply throughout the day.

Our Outdoor Kindy Flatbread Recipe

1kg Flour

- 1 Sachet yeast
- 640ml luke-warm water

Salt



- 1. Mix flour, yeast and water. Knead for
 - 5 minutes and leave to rise for 45 minutes.
- 2. Divide into 16 pieces and flatten into ovals and leave for another 10 minutes.
- 3. Place on the camp-fire grill and cook a few Minutes each side until they puff up.
- 4. Brush with garlic oil, salt, oil and crushed rosemary.



Community Walks - Exploring where we live

We have visited so many wonderful places and businesses in our community and our children are really enjoying meeting the people on our Main Street and finding out what they do and how they use sustainable practices in their business.

Our visit to the Dentist was very informative and so much fun. We were shown so much and learnt a lot too about caring for our teeth and gums. The staff there were so kind, and the children were even allowed to have a go in the dentist chair. We saw xrays of teeth and took home a little goodie bag full of things to care for our teeth.

We visited the CFS Opp shop and Lobethal Community Kindergarten staff were thrilled to present the Lobethal CFS Opp Shop with a \$75 cash donation from the money we raised from our Crazy Hair Day events which were inspired by our visit to the Hairdressers. Our team greatly values the incredible work of the CFS and its volunteers to support our community. Thank you to everyone who supported our fundraiser, it was certainly a very fun way to raise money for an extremely important cause.

At the Butcher, Ashley met us & chatted about his shop, and what people can buy. He let everyone come in & look at the meats & products. We learned that he sells Duck fat to make the best roast potatoes. He explained that sausages do not come from sausage dogs.... Or tigers, like our children thought. They are made from beef off cuts.

Ashley also talked to us about his sustainability practices. The off cuts are sent to a processing plant at Keith to make fertiliser for the grass, & a different processing plant to make into pet food.

Before we left, Ashley gave the small group of children a taste of the ham he sells.

These are just a few of the places we have visited so far. It has been a very busy few weeks Exploring where we live.



What's Happening at Kindy?

End of Year Concert

Every year we celebrate our wonderful year at kindy with a kindy concert. The children get to share their favourite kindy songs and perform the dances they have been taught in their Dancify sessions. It is memorable night for our families and children.

This year we will once again be using the Lobethal Centennial Hall for our concerts.

On the day of the concert, we will walk to the hall after lunch for a rehearsal so our children will become familiar with the stage and the back of the stage area. We will be asking you to pick up your child from the hall after kindy.

You will then need to bring your child back to the hall from 5.30pm. (not before as staff will be preparing and eating their tea) Children will be signed in at the back door of the hall. Only children will be able to go beyond this door. Once the concert is finished you can collect your child from the same door and staff will ensure they are signed out to a parent.

We will be sending out more information regarding Covid restrictions and ticketing sales etc. in the next week or so.

We cannot wait to share this memorable event with our families.



Screen Time and Keeping Ourselves Safe Online

As part of the *Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum* learning this term we have also explored how to keep ourselves safe when online and engaging with technology. We discussed how when using tablets, phones and computers, or watching television, there were important things to remember to keep ourselves safe.

As a group we watched a video of the book *Swoosh, Glide and Rule Number 5* being read, which came from the e-Safety Commissioner site. The five rules in the story were:

- 1. Be kind and take turns
- 2. At dinner time, no screen
- 3. Use it only in shared space
- 4. Ask before you use it
- 5. No taking screens to bed

There is also an Early Years Online Safety for Under 5's which provides practical advice and strategies for parents and carers.

Minister for Environment and Water Visit

We are very excited that we will be having a visit from David Spiers MP, SA's Minister for Environment and Water on Tuesday the 2nd of November.

We invited Mr Spiers to come and see us at Lobethal Kindy to discuss the Environment and Sustainability and to show him the processes we already have in place. We are hoping the visit will lead to working with his department on a project or helping our future directions as a kindergarten.


We just know our children will make him very welcome and show him our current practises. We have no doubt our children will impress him with their knowledge and care for our environment.


Lobethal Community Playgroup
